Frequently Asked Questions

How much will union dues cost me?

Monthly dues costs each member about \$1 per day, and less for apprentices. "Field dues" are paid separately by your employer on your behalf on every paycheque.

What happens when I sign a card?

When you sign a card, the Ontario Pipe Trades Council becomes your bargaining agent. If an employer retaliates against you we will take them to the Ontario Labour Relations Board on your behalf.

Why do some UA contracts have 36 hour work weeks?

9 workers working 40 hours equals 360 hours, by working 36 hours there is room to hire an extra worker while maintaining 360 hours; Increasing productivity, and keeping more people employed.

Will I have Friday's off?

It depends. Some schedules are 4x8hrs and 1x4hrs, some schedules are 4x9hrs, others are 5x8hrs or 4x10hrs.

Will apprentice hours from my last company count towards my apprenticeship with the UA?

Yes, if you have a training agreement with your former employer, your earned hours will be accepted.


